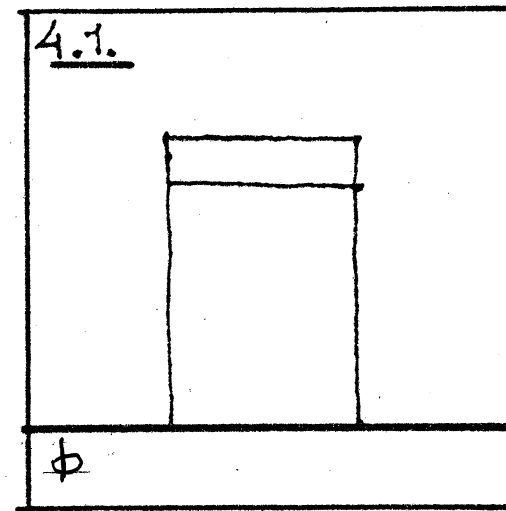
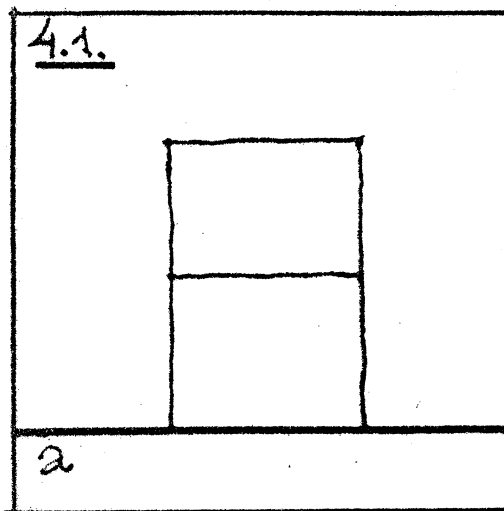

4. “SMALL” AND “LARGE” BUILDINGS.

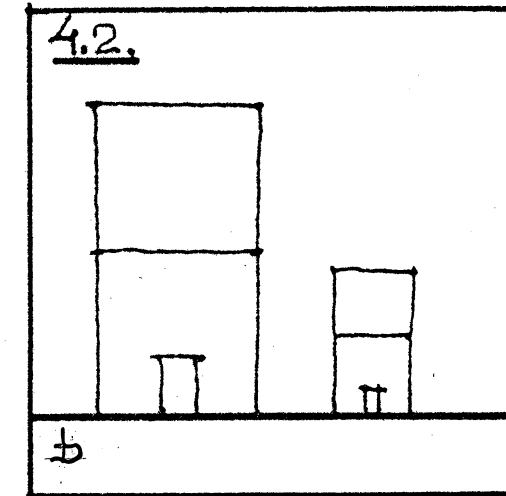
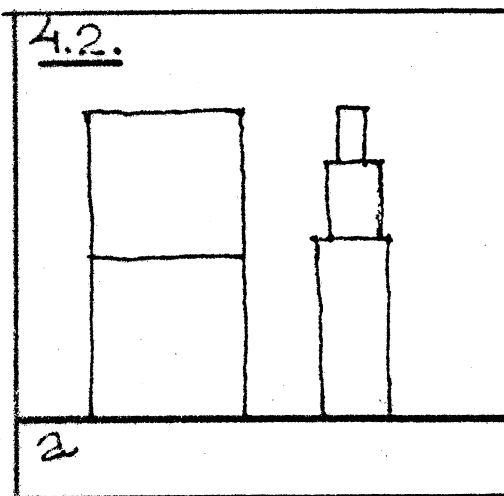
4.1 – proportions of a “small” and “large” building;

a – “small” building; b – “large” building.



4.2 – the “scale trap” effect;

a – the actual dimensions of the “small” and “large” neighboring buildings are the same. b – the actual dimensions of neighboring same type “small” buildings are different.



4.3 – “sizeless” structures;

a – cooling tower. Like many other industrial objects it is “sizeless”, since it does not have modules M-2 and M-3, the sizes of which are known to people through experience. b – Nishin Clinic, Japan. imitates a repeatedly enlarged mechanism. “Sizelessness”, a peculiar “scale trap” – is one of postmodernism’s favorite games.
